



Her former outlook had been based in an intellectual belief of Jesus' life and resurrection.

An elderly man who was a WWII veteran and later trained wild animals for TV shows in the 1960s and 70s recently passed away. Late in life, he began attending services in a nursing home in Coeur d'Alene, where he rediscovered Christ. He was excited to tell his pastor: "I have repented of my sins and He has forgiven me! I believe in Jesus, in eternal life, and that He has gone to prepare a place for me. 



How has God been writing His story into the lives of your people and community?

Connect Church began 2018 by working through *Missional Essentials* together, and the fruit of that study has been evident throughout the year. With each passing day, our people understand more of what it means to live as missionaries in our context. As we discover common threads among individuals living out God's mission, it has even resulted in two new ministries for our campus this year (not to mention the new small groups that began meeting).

We are now a host congregation in partnership with Family Promise, and we are entering our third week of hosting homeless families in Kootenai County. Far more than half our people have been involved by volunteering as overnight teams, meal teams, and with the setup and teardown for the week.

Club of Amazing Moms (CAM) has been meeting throughout the school year, and the dynamic relationships formed with people from our community is resulting in families who do not even attend our church partnering with us in mission.

We are also changing some of the measurables of our ministry by being more accountable to how we are *sent* than by how many *come* to our building each week (or how much money we raise). The Aspen Tree is a significant metaphor for our Connect Church, and the new measurables for all three of the Connect campuses is to become people who commit to:

Acts of Blessing – Bless three people every day. An act of service, words of encouragement, or a simple gift.

Share a Meal – Share a meal with three people each week. Gospel things happen around the table.

Prayer & Listening – Take an hour each week for contemplative prayer. Less about requests and more about listening to the Holy Spirit.

Engage the Gospels – Spend time in the gospels each day (along with other Scriptures) to know and follow Jesus for who He really is.

Nightly Recap – Taking time to examine how we are partnering with or resisting the Holy Spirit each day.

We desire to become a people of mission. We want to be known by our love for one another.

How has God been writing His story into the lives of your people and community?

Our desire is to look beyond ourselves and see the needs of others in our neighborhood and surrounding community.

In August our youth and children's ministries canvassed our church's neighborhood inviting them to a free outdoor movie for the whole family. We then gathered together in lawn chairs with our neighbors and fellowshipped, served concessions, and watched the movie. The number of guests is increasing each year.

Our ladies stuffed large purses with essentials (toiletries, bottled water, snacks, stationery and stamps, etc.), that would be given out to homeless women in our community. This process led us into working with "The Jonah Project," an organization working with victims of human trafficking right in our own city. They need supplies and volunteers to assist in the ministry. Our congregation is collecting supplies and delivering them each month. God is opening new ways all the time for us to serve him.

We hosted a "Full Circle Speaker" for Operation Christmas Child Shoebox ministry. Jackie began as an orphan in Guatemala where she received a shoebox, later was adopted by a U.S. family, and now in her twenties travels and speaks to others about the ministry.

We endeavor to grow in our faith by providing many opportunities to study God's Word together, prayer groups and teaching times to learn to walk like Christ. Recently we held a four-week seminar on Christian Conduct from the Church of the Nazarene Manual.

Transitions tend to evoke a variety of emotions—fear, grief, uncertainty, excitement, etc.—and as a result transitions are often unsettling times. The transition at Spokane Valley has been all of those things, and yet, the faithfulness of God has been so very evident.

Here are a few of the ways that God's faithfulness has been manifest this past year:

- Pastor Craig and Leatha Frank served as the interim pastor, and they did
 an incredible job. They were a steadying presence during the time of
 transition; their love for God and love for people shone brightly through
 their lives.
- Another example of God's faithfulness during this transition can be seen
 in the raising up of leaders in the church. Numerous individuals
 responded obediently to God's call to live out their lives for the
 furthering of God's Kingdom. Each of these people bring God-given gifts
 and passions that have, and will continue to have, a positive influence in
 our congregation and community.
- During the transition time, the congregation also had the opportunity to pay down the principal of our mortgage in order to lower the required monthly payments. Because of the transition this was not pushed, and yet this past year more than \$200,000 in principal has been paid down on the mortgage.
- In recent months we have also begun to pray intentionally for those in our spheres of influence who do not know Jesus. This includes the 25,000 people within two miles of the church who are not committed to any congregation, and it also includes many family members, friends, neighbors, co-workers, and classmates. Already we have seen friends and family come and members of the community who were "drawn" to our church.

These are just some of the reasons that we say, "Thanks be to God." God is faithful, and we desire to be a congregation that partners with what God is doing in our midst.



- we have had several deepen their commitment to Jesus




