District Leadership Reports

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT 2021

NORTHWEST DISTRICT CHURCH OF THE NAZARENE

As we entered into this church year the pandemic threatened to undermine our mission as churches and as a district. Our communities and church buildings went into shut-down. We were ordered to isolate. We couldn't hug each other or even shake hands. We couldn't pass offering plates. We could not meet face to face. And when we thought our situation couldn't get any worse, there was a violent awareness of the racial divides in our culture. And then our world got worse still as the political climate turned ever more toxic. Churches and pastors became lightning rods for anger over any and all of these issues. For example, some people were furious if everyone didn't wear a mask. Other people were furious if anyone wore a mask. This has been a dark and challenging time for us all.

Psalm 139:12 says:

"...even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you."

The Psalmist makes the observation that even the darkest of situations has light when God is present. This year, over and over again, dark places were made bright by the presence of God, through His church.

Churches and Leaders Embodied the Light of God

I am pleased to report that all over our district, during this dark year, pastors and church leaders called their people to prayer. When churches could not meet in person, many were ready to use the live-streaming technology they already had. Other churches and pastors moved quickly to adapt to meeting outside or to learn quickly how to stream services and devotionals online. Social media was used as a hub for churches to keep people connected. Some churches rediscovered the ancient practices of snail mail and phone calls to stay connected. Pastors shared best practices with each other with renewed energy. Leadership teams developed ways to have meetings online and learned to adjust quickly to ever-changing regulations and challenges. Churches found new ways to spread out the responsibility of checking on people who were in danger of being isolated.

This flexible, adaptable, and missional work is a credit to the ongoing deep relationships our district has cultivated over the years. Good work like this does not happen by accident, it is God's relational light, embodied in God's people. You, the churches, Clusters, pastors & spouses, tech people, board members, and district leadership teams, have worked together in ways similar to what has been done before, but with a renewed urgency as we faced strain and unrelenting challenges. This good work is light in a dark world. "In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." Matthew 5:16. Our mission as a district is to equip local churches to transform their communities. As our churches and people shine in this dark time, our broader communities

will be changed. The following paragraphs include examples of how I have been working with our district to equip local churches to be light in this dark time.

District Prayer Team

This year a District Prayer Team was established. I want to thank the fifty-two people who have signed up and regularly pray over issues relating to our district. These prayer warriors receive weekly updates about the needs of Northwest District ministries, including the needs of pastors, leaders, events, churches, and groups of our great Northwest District. I have personally felt the power of these prayers as I have ventured into some very difficult circumstances. Only people who sign up are added to this email list. Support and Accountability

Every Christian needs support and accountability. How much more every pastor? How much more a district superintendent? We need the support and grace of other Christians to encourage us and pour hope into us. We also need accountability, which is less popular, but just as valuable. We need help with blind spots and weaknesses even though we resist evaluation. The pastor & leadership reviews I have facilitated this year have been an important, vision-based process. I also participated in my own review this year with our District Advisory Board (DAB) and with the help of General Superintendent, Dr. Eugene Duarte. I want to thank Advisory Board Secretary, Chad Wilks for his leadership in this process. The world around us resists evaluation. I pray that our district continues to cultivate a culture of Godly support and accountability.

Working with Churches and Pastors in Transition

One of the ongoing blessings of my role as DS is getting to know local church boards and board secretaries. In each church I experience a diverse gifting in the leadership around the board table, with a common passion for Christ and His church. I am impressed with the flexibility and patience of board teams as they needed to meet online and find creative ways to call pastors during the pandemic. I am thrilled with the caliber of new pastors who have joined our district. Each one has prayerfully and faithfully accepted the call of God through a local church and moved during a time of crisis. What a joy it is to be part of the calling process of each church and pastor relationship.

Multicultural Ministry: Coordinator, Herminia Esqueda

The world is watching to see if the church of Jesus has any answers to the racial divides of our culture. We must live out the Gospel message that is powerfully multicultural. We all know our future in heaven will be all nations worshiping God. My prayer is, "Oh God, Your will be done in our churches as it is in heaven!" To this end, I have asked Herminia Esqueda to be our new Multicultural Coordinator, and she is beginning to help us make intentional steps of progress. This year we started having our district newsletters and our weekly prayer emails translated into Spanish. We have so many local and district leaders who are working to broaden our multicultural impact. We have much to learn and many ways to grow.

We Closed Two Churches This Year

After much prayer and discussions with pastors and boards, it was decided to close Heppner and Royal City churches. In both cases we agonized over the whole process. The final services of Royal City and Heppner were celebrations of many years of ministry and many changed lives. Both properties have buyers. A Spanish-speaking Assembly of God congregation is buying the Royal City building, and a hospital is buying the Heppner building. The DAB is strategically stewarding funds from these sales for future multicultural work. I want to thank the pastors, church leaders, and district leaders who faithfully followed Jesus even in this hard work.

District Advisory Board Teams

I have always enjoyed working with teams. I want to celebrate with raucous applause our Advisory Board's willingness to be active team members of our four different board committees. Committees in general can have the reputation as dead end discussion groups for good plans to wither. Our DAB teams have been where all the action is! Each team has had great leadership and great participation from people who I want to acknowledge are already very busy. Here are highlights of each team's contributions:

Mission Action Team: Chair, Mike Malmin

This team oversees the mission statement of the district and thinks forward. They hold the DS and the Advisory board accountable for addressing ongoing racial reconciliation, and are tasked with dreaming and planning how to more effectively raise up Hispanic and other multicultural leaders on our district. Herminia Esqueda led this team initially until she became the Multicultural Coordinator for the district. As Mike Malmin stepped into leadership midway through the year, we moved to try to listen more to our current Hispanic leaders and empower them. We also made strategic moves to advocate for finances to be made available for leadership development for multicultural ministry to grow on the district level. In addition, the Mission Action Team is beginning to dream about what a district plan for church planting could look like, and oversees the Next Steps Grant process.

Finance & Insurance Team: Chair, Rod Emerson

The Finance Team is tasked with stewardship of all resources coming in and going out of the district. They oversee all fiduciary interests of the auxiliaries and ministries of the district. This team oversees development, monitoring, and implementation of the budget. They have been incredibly proactive in addressing how we would manage district funds and obligations during the pandemic. When this year's crisis began they immediately moved to set aside resources to help churches and ministries who might be affected. They moved quickly to equip the DS with resources readily available for assistance. They communicated clearly and often. They reevaluated district investment strategies throughout a tumultuous year, and did not panic. At every turn they aggressively sought to equip local churches to thrive. This team also worked with oversight of new assets that God provided in cooperation with other DAB teams.

Properties Team: Chair, Dale Shaffer

This team oversees district properties and also helps local churches with property changes, building, and remodels. They have successfully navigated a difficult year as several churches were in the midst of projects and facility changes. Districts often fight the general perception that they want to micro-manage local churches, but this group works hard to come alongside churches as partners and co-laborers. The most significant work of this team was in the church closures of Royal City and Heppner. Both of those facilities are in the process of being sold and those resources are being allocated for future ministry.

Pastor & Church Health Team: Chair, Chad Wilks

This team helps coordinate the effort to support pastors and churches, and in a year of crisis this committee came through with significance. They are working to evaluate our current systems like Clusters and retreats. The most powerful work this team did was in the development of the 2021 Pastor Support Project. Through a district donor, we were provided with resources to consider how we could help pastors as they face pressures related to Covid-19, church, family, finances, and political pressure. This team created a solid plan to provide funds for a marriage retreat, counseling, and a partnership with Compass Initiative. God truly did a miracle of provision as we co-created a plan to help God's shepherds with the support they need to survive and thrive in this difficult season. The story below describes how this miracle of provision came about.

Radical Generosity and Provision

A very bright light in this season of darkness is the radical generosity and provision of God through a local church. Pastor Ryan Pennington of our Pasco Nazarene church had been faithfully preaching and teaching his people about biblical stewardship, and how God calls His people to be radically generous. A business owner in Pastor Ryan's church began to feel the prompting of the Holy Spirit as he studied and prayed. The insights of biblical generosity came together with a burden for pastors in our region. This prompted an online meeting with Pastor Ryan, our donor, myself, and our district finance chairperson, Rod Emerson. This business owner felt called to give monthly from his business, and was asking, "What would the district do with more resources?" As Rod and I pondered that question, we included the DAB Pastor Health Team and began to hear their burden for pastors in the area of finances, counseling, and marriages. The Pastor Support Project emerged. Since our district finances were in good order, we diverted some other unused funds to begin this project immediately. Through it all, God was leading and working through a local church and district leadership to provide generously for pastors. I want to say to every pastor on the district, God knows you by name and knows how hard this year has been for you and your family. God worked this Support Project out to get a very practical message through to you. Keep your eyes open. God will provide!

What is Next?

1. We must push ourselves to embrace multi-demographic ministry. Each church must fight the temptation of being a mono-demographic body. Mono-demographic churches are congregations who are the same age, same economic status, same ethnicity, same religious background, same skin color, same political party, etc. We must

recognize the God-inspired value of the fellowship of followers of Jesus who are from different demographics. Iron sharpens iron because of friction. We must break out of our comfortable mono-demographic trends, and listen to minority voices.

- 2. **We must change our metrics.** When we only measure and track attendance numbers we are only measuring a result, or lagging number. What If we could begin to proactively measure and track future goals with steps and progress?
- 3. We must make disciples. I am so excited for the good work our denomination has been doing by defining discipleship as a journey of grace. All over the world, people have defined discipleship in many different ways. As a district, we will be learning together through SDMI ministries how to engage people in the journey of grace that is discipleship.

The American church is statistically in decline, but don't ever believe the church is dying. The gates of hell will not stand against the church that Jesus builds. A pandemic may close the doors of buildings, but God's people have the faith to find ways to advance the cause of Christ. The world is working harder and harder to tell people they should embrace their own selfish desires, emotions, and self-seeking lives. It is not popular to promote identity with Christ or being crucified with Christ. However, everyone wishes they had life filled with love and meaning. True love and meaning will only come through Christ! We are carriers of this message of Jesus. We are the living body of Christ in the world today. We are the light. (Matthew 5:14)

I want to thank the multitude of people on our district who have prayed faithfully for Melissa and I. I want to thank the Advisory Board and Auxiliary leaders who have been so collaborative this year. I want to thank the district office team who have worked so hard and are so talented! I want to thank my wife, Melissa, who is the most supportive teammate anyone could ask for. I want to thank Jesus for saving me, and being the Light.

I was standing on a street corner in a city seven thousand miles from home. My thoughts had been on the class I was preparing to teach the next day when my attention was drawn to the sound of children in a nearby square. These noticeably thin kids seemed to be squabbling for the best position on the steps of a monument. Or could it have been that the "lucky" few who had the clear plastic bags were not willing to give in to the demands that they share its contents? Every couple of minutes I could see one of the children put their bag to their mouth and inhale the fumes from what appeared to be wet paint, scarring their precious brains but chasing away the stabbing pains of hunger for a few more hours. Jesus came that they might have life, and here was I, watching the thief stealing it from them. I felt sick and helpless. I knew little about their culture and less of their language. What I did know was that their only hope was the gospel. This was all I had to give and my only reason for being there.

It is heartbreaking and overwhelming when one realizes that a similar scene plays out, every day, in ten thousand cities around the world. My mortal mind cannot comprehend such bleak, hopeless suffering on a world scale.

In Genesis 21 we read of Hagar and her son Ishmael. Cast out and abandoned, dying of thirst and despair in the desert, Hagar and Ishmael were alone and unnoticed. Or so they thought. God was there. God heard their pitiful cries. No one escapes His attention. Perhaps I was mistaken. Perhaps there was another reason for me being there on that street corner. Perhaps God wanted me to notice too.

NMI exists for this purpose; to rally and mobilize your church to engage in the mission efforts of the Church of the Nazarene and to inform your congregation what the Church of the Nazarene is doing to take Christ's transformational love to every person on the planet. NMI exists to help the church notice those who are dying in the hopeless clutches of sin and point them to the only solution for their bleak situation, to the only relief for their never-ending pain. All over this planet the Church of the Nazarene is striving to go where the church is not yet; striving to hear the cries of the lost, the suffering, the abandoned; striving to introduce them to the Messiah we were introduced to.

Your NW District NMI accomplishes this through education about missions, nurturing the spirit of missions, developing, sending and supporting missionaries, and being the global missions advocate in every local church. We encourage every local church to elect an NMI president who will lead the effort to educate their church about missions and who will invite missionaries to speak to their church and support them in their efforts to take the gospel of Christ to the world. Your local church can help raise money for Church of the Nazarene mission efforts around the world. You can get your children and youth engaged in missions and create opportunities for God to speak to individuals who might then be called into missions. Your district NMI unites local churches in projects that will help engage our people in missions and in developing relationships with the church around the world. Teen Camp is gearing up for a full, in-person camp experience at Riverview Bible Camp. We hope that you and the teens at your church are getting excited for what God is going to do through it! They can still be made available to you if you missed out on them.

Native American Ministries Director Report

This is, indeed, a very difficult life on planet earth. Every person in our ministries has been greatly impacted this year.

I began Native American ministry in 1958. I am a descendant of the Cherokee, Chickasaw, and Choctaw Nations. Maternally, Gerri is enrolled in the Yankton Sioux Tribe of South Dakota and paternally is descendant of the Wintu, Nomlaki, and Wailaki of Northern California. It has been a challenging calling. Over the years I have preached and ministered in native churches, traditional gatherings, and reservations in Washington, Oregon, Montana, South Dakota, Arizona, New Mexico, and Oklahoma. I have been among traditional, ceremonial, and native elders for years. And for the most part, the people have been accepting at least on the surface and were friendly toward Christianity.

Today, it is more difficult and somewhat hostile with some younger people who want to identify as "native" who consider Christianity and the Bible as foreign and European. What I am hearing among some is that to accept Christianity is proselytizing. Last year I heard one man say if he was a Christian "I wouldn't be (named his Tribe)." I see a growing disinterest toward the Bible, sin, and Jesus being The only means to reconciliation with the Father. Some question if there is any need to be reconciled. Yet, I stand firm on my calling for living as Jesus lived, living in the context of traditional native cultures.

Before the pandemic, we had been absorbed in the Community with funerals, Seven Drum Longhouse, men's sweat lodge, Elder Peace Maker Circle, hospital calls, and powwows. Understandably, we all have been quarantined. The Tribe posted large signs on the major highway stating that people who had no familial or other essential business must continue on their journey.

Our report here is very limited and our mileage was greatly reduced. We participated in one wake, three burials, one wedding, one family gathering, one visit with the District Superintendent, two sweat lodges, two meetings with Kalispel tribal members, and one dressing ceremony. We are continuing to provide transportation and support to a young lady to appear in Tribal Court. This is a 90-mile round trip. We encourage her to complete her assignment in community service.

Chaplaincy Ministries Director Report

It has been my privilege to serve as the NW District chaplain representative this past year. This year has been exceptionally challenging for all, and this has also been true for chaplains. I know that as a hospital chaplain I worked throughout the entirety of the pandemic, which was taxing while also allowing for amazing ministry opportunities. I want to begin by expressing my appreciation to the chaplains who, in the middle of a pandemic, have continued to minister to individuals, families, inmates, strangers and friends during these challenging times.

I have had the opportunity this year to connect with chaplains who serve on this district as full-time and volunteer chaplains in prisons, hospice organizations, hospitals and with first responders. I have consistently heard how challenging this year has been, while also hearing stories of God at work, even in a pandemic! I had one chaplain share with me that they are "constantly amazed at how God uses me/us to spread His love." This is a sentiment that is expressed by so many chaplains, and one that I too echo. It is a great privilege to serve our Lord and support the ministry of the church wherever God leads.

As I write this report, I cannot help but be reminded of the countless individuals and families I have journeyed with at the hospital where I minister. This has been a year like no other, and sadly it has been a year that has taken so much from far too many. It is also a year that has opened doors for ministry, support and creativity as never before. I would invite the pastors and leaders from the district to continue connecting with your local chaplain(s) for ongoing communication and support. I personally have found it meaningful when I am able to work with local churches and pastors.

This past year we began to purposefully connect our district chaplains with one another and with our DS Rev. Mowry. My name is Herminia Esqueda. My husband, Armando, and I started a small church plant in Granger, WA about six years ago. In September of 2019 Armando became the lead pastor at Wapato Church of the Nazarene. This week Armando will be ordained as an elder in the Church of the Nazarene. We honestly could not have taken this journey without the support of our Northwest District leadership, past and present, and our Hispanic Cluster. Randy Craker, Dana Benscoter, Bob Luhn, Luis Rodriguez, Fred Fuentes and David Mowry have been instrumental in encouraging Armando to pursue his calling. Thank you for your faithfulness to God's kingdom.

In February, our Hispanic cluster met for the first time in over a year. Although it was virtual, it was nice to see faces and hear stories of God's faithfulness. We praise the Lord for Pastor Doroteo Rivera's healing. He had been recently discharged from the hospital after fighting COVID. He and Patricia continue to minister locally in Moses Lake and internationally over the radio. Please pray as they begin to raise funds to purchase their own radio frequency. Pastor Jose and Pastor Juana Gonzales shared that they have been counseling families virtually from their home in Pasco. They long to be able to meet with families face to face. We welcomed Pastor Julio Barragan, who shared his testimony about God's transforming work in his life. He and his wife Alina minister to Spanish speaking families at Yakima Trinity. Rigoberto and Krista Dominguez and Jacob Ochoa are all pursuing ordination and active in ministry at Yakima Trinity. Rev. Fred Fuentes, Kennewick Discipulos de Hoy, is our pillar of strength. He and his wife Severa remain steadfast with their gentle encouragement and endless hope of Christ's work in us. Pastor Walter Delgado, Wenatchee Rios de Agua Viva, is pastoring, studying, working, and raising his young family along with his wife Guadalupe. Please pray as we look for ways we can support young pastors like Walter in practical ways, so they can pursue God's calling. We also welcome Samuel Arteaga who has been ministering with Ron Hunter in Okanagan Valley. Samuel has agreed to translate our district communication into Spanish.

John and Gerri Gros Venor continue to serve the Native American community on the Colville Reservation. The last year has been especially challenging as COVID has shined a light on the health and economic disparities that impact the Native American community. Recently, I was listening to Siouxsan Robinson, president of The Red Road ministry. She spoke of the hesitancy of some of her family to follow Jesus because they see him as the "white man's God" and she said she always responds that "Jesus is one of us." Please continue to pray for the Gros Venors as they embody Christ's love to our indigenous brothers and sisters.

Spokane First Church ministers to the Chin (Myanmar) refugee population through a Parent Affiliated Congregation. Please pray for our Asian-American and Pacific Islander communities. There has been a spike in Anti-Asian hate crimes since the onset of COVID. May we stand in solidarity with all of our brothers and sisters. Listen, learn, and act in support of the immigrant and refugee community.

I accepted this position to come alongside you, in the same way others have come alongside us, as you minister in your local context and create spaces of belonging for every tribe, tongue, and nation in your community. May we be a glimpse of His Kingdom on earth as it is in heaven.

Northwest Connect Ministry Center Director Report

This year, like all ministries, has been a series of adjustments and changes for Northwest Connect. Early February 2020, we recognized we would need to make significant alterations to our ministries and services in the event of a pandemic. Specifically, the Food Pantry began asking our families if they would prefer delivered groceries in the event of disruptions related to Covid. This took a very coordinated effort of phone calls and questionnaires in Russian and English. (A special thank you to Pastor Natalya Skala from Cle Elum who called our Ukrainian families.) Additionally, we recognized we needed to ensure the safety of our volunteers. It was decided that we would deliver groceries to our most at-risk clients and provide grocery pick up by preparing grocery boxes by family size and delivering/loading in the parking lot for the remaining families. This limited the potential Covid exposure of our volunteers, and we did not have any significant problems. On average we delivered groceries to 38 families every month and continue to do so now. For 2020 we provided 183,915 pounds of groceries to our neighbors through deliveries and parking lot pick up.

The Hand Up Ministry continued to serve our community with non-food pantry items like cleaning supplies, paper goods and hygiene items. These services were moved to the parking lot and evolved into a drive-up distribution process.

Kids Zone moved its ministries to the parking lot as weather allowed and continued to serve our families in various ways. We assisted Shaw Middle school with groceries for sack lunch distribution which included Regal Elementary school families. We provided activity packets and snacks for Kids Zone families on special occasions like Santa's workshop and other holidays. Additionally, we provided school supplies related to at-home virtual learning. Kids Zone also served by providing two holiday drive through dinners for Thanksgiving and Valentine's Day.

At this point we are compelled to express our heartfelt gratitude to the NWC volunteers and staff who supported our ministries throughout the pandemic. The changes required more time, heavier lifting and cold parking lot hours. NWC could not operate without the 30-40 volunteers who dedicate their time to these ministries. We are humbled by this commitment to being the hands and feet of the Gospel in Spokane.

Northwest Connect continues to explore ways of connecting with families and other ministries. And we continue to partner with the Connections House, Oxford House, Life Services and Relationship Advantage.

The NWC Board and Leadership are in the planning stages of rehabbing the church parsonage for ministry. We are prayerfully looking toward the future in anticipation of what God has in store for Northwest Connect.

Second Chance Discipleship Ministries Executive Director Report

This year was a very different year for our ministries due to COVID. We spent most of the year February through October sharing the gospel on the street and providing Grab and Go breakfast and lunch.

We served 13,173 meals this year to our homeless community, which included breakfast and lunch as well as dinner on Sundays. That is the only day there is not a hot dinner meal in our community. We had three cars repaired so those individuals could travel to and from work.

We preached the gospel to 380 different individuals. Fifteen individuals we know of gave their lives to be followers of Christ. This makes a total of 87 new believers in the last six years. Two more discipleship groups for the homeless were started, in addition to the previous 10.

In addition, we hosted youth groups to intern at the Homeless Ministry from California, Vancouver Washington and Sandpoint Idaho. This ministry provides opportunity to serve, do street evangelism, and prepare foods.

Our Families In Crisis Ministry, for families on the street or a car with children, provided 14 bed nights for families totaling 62 individuals, as well as provided meals and prayer. Strengthening Families, an international program with 30 years of success and 80% efficacy, began this year. The Department of Health and Welfare refers families who are being watched and without improvement will lose their children to foster care. We educated, trained, and modeled how to have a meal, conflict resolution, alternatives to violence, drug or alcohol twelve step programs if needed, and how to shop and budget. We provide mentors to disciple these individuals.

In Africa, our sixth church building is being completed in Ogembo, Africa, for a total of eight churches with total membership of 425. The Jesus Film was shown in remote villages in six areas in December of 2019. 78 men, women and children raised hands to receive Christ, resulting in 38 baptisms.

Education Report

Education

We strongly urge local churches to pray for **Northwest Nazarene University** (www.nnu.edu), **Nazarene Theological Seminary** (www.nts.edu), and **Nazarene Bible College** (www.nbc.edu); for their presidents, administrators, faculties, and Boards of Trustees.

We recommend that each local church support Northwest Nazarene University in the following ways:

- Although the General Church has changed the Educational Budget formula from 2.5% to 2.25% of current church income, we encourage each church to rally behind our University by paying the Educational Budget weekly or monthly at the 2.5% rate. We also strongly urge churches who have not been paying this budget to plan this year to pay in full.
- By encouraging every Nazarene young person to seriously investigate the possibility of attending NNU.
- By encouraging persons to invest in NNU through life income contracts, trusts, annuities, and by including the university in their wills, enabling it to raise additional funds for scholarships for deserving students.
- By contributing annually to the University Fund and other scholarship opportunities.
- By encouraging the constituents in our Idaho churches to participate in the state tax deduction program for contributions made to NNU, and that Idaho pastors cooperate with the university in making this information available to our people.
- By making plans for 11th and 12th grade students to visit the NNU campus during one of the several NNU Overnight or NNU Church Days offered during the school year.
- By encouraging 9th to 12th grade students to attend The Gathering, a regional event.
- By purchasing a copy of the Oasis.
- By using NNU promotional materials.
- By encouraging pastors and/or associates to visit their students on the campus of NNU yearly, taking advantage of the housing and meals made available by the university for such visits.
- The Admissions Counselor for our district is Coco Gall. She may be contacted at 208-467-8481 or cgall@nnu.edu.
- That NNU be encouraged to utilize the resources of the alumni, pastors, and trustees of Northwest District to provide recruitment and public relations assistance, and that NNU make available to those persons program materials and training for such purposes.
- · That each church observe Nazarene University Day during the spring break in March as a further means of highlighting the significant ministry our regional university affords our young people in preparing them for life as good stewards of God's grace.
- That each congregation appoint an NNU Representative, who will accept responsibility for receiving and distributing communications from NNU. The representative will also work in conjunction with the pastor/pastoral

· Trustees Matching Scholarship. As a way of acknowledging the important contribution Nazarene churches make to NNU, the Trustees Matching Scholarship was initiated on behalf of students who come from our churches. This award is provided according to the following factor and criteria.

That each local church develop its local Christian education program:

- By encouraging our people to read books conducive to Christian growth.
- By planning for Continuing Lay Training programs for its leaders at discipleshipplace.org.
- By providing financial assistance for continuing education opportunities for pastors and local leaders.

That personnel in local churches be encouraged to participate in local public education committees and boards and that pastors and people involve themselves concerning education in public schools.

That churches located near secular colleges or universities seek means of providing meaningful religious guidance and activities for students and families. Campus Ministries, Global Ministry Center, 17001 Prairie Star Parkway, Lenexa, KS 66220 can be of assistance.

That each church contemplating the establishment of day-care centers, preschool programs, and private parochial schools shall obtain prior approval from the District Advisory Board for such programs.

We encourage each local church to strive to be Mission Priority One by

- Praying for mission endeavors and missionaries throughout the world.
- Teaching adults, youth and children about Nazarene missions, missionaries and ministry on a global level. We encourage the promotion of NMI endeavors from the pulpit and through the use of social media, posters, bulletin inserts and printed materials such as the missionary reading books, and by inviting special speakers.
- Giving of the church's resources such as time, skills and finances.
- Giving at least 5.5% of total church income to the World Evangelism Fund and paying the NMI allocation to the district.
- Promoting missions to children and youth, helping them learn about and participate in mission endeavors and supporting those who feel called to mission service.
- Participating in LINKS; Loving, Interested, Nazarenes Knowing and Sharing. This is our personal connection to our Nazarene missionaries.
- Participating in special NMI offerings such as Alabaster, Thanksgiving, Easter, World Missions Broadcast and Nazarene Compassionate Ministries.

We encourage each local church to consider every church member to also be an NMI Member and count every non-member who attends and participates in NMI programs or activities as Associate NMI Members.

We encourage each local church to participate in the annual **District Project** by raising funds and sending team members for Work and Witness projects abroad and within the district.

We encourage each local church to have at least two missionaries for **deputation** services during the church year. We would also like to encourage churches of any size to consider scheduling both Sunday morning and mid-week services. Missionaries are happy to speak to groups of any size.

- We encourage each church to communicate with their visiting missionary to address any special needs such as lodging, transportation, food or internet access.
- · We encourage a generous offering be received at the completion of the message by the missionary. Some churches may choose to establish a minimum amount in order to ensure the church has satisfactorily supported the missionary.
- We also encourage churches to be sensitive to the needs of the visiting missionary. Although offerings are sent to Global Treasury Services in Kansas City, MO, missionaries also have immediate expenses or needs that the church can help with by receiving a love offering or by designating a portion of the offering received to be given directly to the missionary.
- Try to spend time with the missionary. Most missionaries love staying in homes and if you know someone sensing a call to serve as a missionary, this is the perfect time to introduce them to the missionary.

We encourage each local NMI council to meet regularly and use all resources available to them.

We encourage each church to faithfully support and pray for the LINKS missionary assigned to their local church by remembering their birthdays, anniversaries and holidays. The LINKS annual assignment is included in the District Expense Fund.

We encourage each local church to support the Nazarene Health Care Plan by purchasing **Memorial Roll** certificates for any deceased person and presenting **Distinguished Service Awards** to honor those living.

We urge local churches to support a child through **Child Sponsorship**, particularly one who is being served by one of the NW District's Child Development Centers in Bangladesh; Bachagram or Durgadanga.

We encourage people to be involved in Work and Witness projects.

- 1. That each church responds appropriately to the call to make disciples. Our Sunday Schools should be a place where people of all ages can study, discuss, understand, and apply God's Word, finding their direction and empowerment for service as they continue in prayer before God.
- 2. That all churches cooperate by sending representatives to District Assembly, encouraging a strong annual participation at this event from the church body.
- 3. That every local Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries Board strive to: increase 5% or more in average regular Sunday School attendance over the figure reported to the last District Assembly and to increase 5% or more in the active Sunday School Responsibility List (Enrollment) over the figure reported to the last District Assembly.
- 4. That every local Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries Board create as many new Sunday School classes as possible, realizing that new classes grow faster than existing classes.
- 5. That every Sunday School teacher present the plan of salvation to their classes with the idea of harvesting what has been planted.
- 6. That every local Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries Board be aware of and cooperate enthusiastically with the district directors of adult, youth, and children's ministries.
- 7. That the Sunday School attendance statistics be published on the Northwest District website (www.nwdistrict.org).
- 8. That every local Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries Board order "Resource" magazines for each Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries worker.
- 9. That every local Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries Board use curriculum provided through The Foundry Publishing (formerly NPH) as its primary resource.
- 10. That every church offer Continuing Lay Training courses to its workers at discipleshipplace.org.
- 11. That every church urge their children, youth, and adults to participate in the many quality camps, retreats, and conferences and send their pastoral staff to camps, retreats, and conferences.
- 12. That every local Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries Board consider formation of small-group ministries that are formed around special interests or felt needs of the members. Such support groups often meet the needs of people seldom reached by traditional materials. These groups should have a built-in accountability and monitoring system by the local Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries Board.
- 13. That the Sunday School Ministry Core Values are: The Bible as Authority, Creating Community, View All People as Potential Family.

"Bring all the tithes into the storehouse so there will be enough food in my temple. If you do," says the Lord, the Almighty, "I will open the windows of heaven for you. I will pour out a blessing so great you won't have enough room to take it in! Try it! Let me prove it to you!" (Malachi 3:10, NLT). We remind our people of the New Testament concept of total stewardship: that we are custodians of all God has given us. We believe every church should plan carefully to meet the spiritual responsibility to God and His Church in reaching all who would come to Him through the World Evangelism Fund, Education, Pensions and Benefits, and District Budgets as well as Compassionate Ministries and the operating budget of the local church.

We, your Finance Committee, submit the following report and request that the report of the Assembly Finance Committee be presented at the first board meeting of the local church after District Assembly.

I. Pastoral Support

There are several issues that need to be faithfully monitored for the care and growth of our pastors. We ask each local church board to annually consider the following:

1. Salary

- That church boards give consideration to yearly salary adjustments;
- That part of the annual consideration be both a cost of living and merit salary adjustment;
- That consideration be given each year to adjusting all benefits, such as housing allowances, utilities, insurance, social security reimbursement and car and travel reimbursements, commensurate with current increased cost of living figures;
- That boards with bi-vocational pastors carefully review compensation and take all possible steps to move toward full support;
- That for assistance in determining pastoral compensation, the district office has a copy of the 2018 Compensation Handbook for Church Staff for reference, or for more up to date information, the site www.churchlawandtax.com/salary/ provides useful information.

2. Ministerial Debt

- That churches having pastors who accumulated debt in the pursuit of ministerial preparation (college, Bible college, and seminary) consider helping lift that burden through a monthly or annual contribution to loan payments;
- That pastors be encouraged to utilize the resources available through the COMPASS Initiative, which provides a financial literacy, management, and well-being program to equip ministers in personal and church financial matters and offers grants for debt reduction and retirements savings (to ministers who qualify); more information can be found at www.compassinitiative.org.

3. Housing

- That for pastors living in church-owned housing, annual consideration be given to providing a taxsheltered annuity (TSA) or other savings plan, as an alternative to acquiring an equity build-up in a house;
- That the trustees of the local church, in consultation with the pastor, interact regularly regarding parsonage and property maintenance and make at least one annual inspection to be certain the home is livable in every regard;
- That, if the housing is secured through rental properties, the trustees annually assure that the home is adequate and appropriate for the pastoral family;
- That the housing allowance be established annually (in December) for pastors, to comply with IRS regulations.

4. Vacation

- That the pastor be given a minimum of two weeks paid vacation annually for up to five years of pastoral experience;
- That there be a minimum of three weeks paid vacation for pastors with five or more years pastoral experience;
- That there be a minimum of four weeks paid vacation for pastors with fifteen or more years pastoral experience;
- That time away for district and general functions and continuing education not be counted as vacation time;
- That the time of vacation be determined in counsel with the church board.

5. Study Leave and Sabbatical

- That the church board consider giving its pastor an annual study leave of one or two weeks for the purpose of in-depth preparation for preaching, teaching, and for leadership development;
- That, during each seventh consecutive year of service in one local congregation, the church consider extending a sabbatical leave of no less than sixty days (Manual 129.10);
- That the church consider the sabbatical as a time for rest and renewal, providing opportunity for a pastor to gain a fresh vision for continued service in the church;
- That the pastor and board enter into dialog of how that sabbatical time would be used and that agreements be reached prior to the event;
- That the board would not consider either of these as a replacement of the pastor's regular vacation time.

6. Continuing Education

That church boards encourage their pastors to enroll in pastoral education programs and support
their attendance by providing remuneration for at least one such continuing education program
annually (this would be in addition to the regularly planned pastors' meetings sponsored by the
district).

7. Library

• That church boards give consideration to providing a fund for pastors to increase their personal library resources for continuing education purposes.

8. General Assembly

• That each local church consider providing financial assistance for the senior pastor to attend General Assembly. Consider providing financial assistance to the pastoral staff as well. Budgeting over a four-year period and setting aside an amount annually is helpful in achieving this goal.

9. Health Insurance

- That the local church provide pastor and dependents and full time paid staff medical insurance
 via a Church Group Health Policy or provide for health insurance premium reimbursement for
 pastor and dependents via a tax free HRA (Health Reimbursement Account). If electing an HRA
 Plan, refer to the district email about HRA's sent in December 2016 (contact the district office
 for more information). Consult a tax advisor for the correct way to account for health insurance
 premiums that are reimbursed;
- That the district does have a life and dental insurance plan available for pastors that will be maintained as long as it is feasible;
- That all pastors Medicare eligible should give strong consideration to enrolling in Medicare, Part
 B (physician services) and Pharmacy Plan D in addition to purchasing a Medicare Supplemental
 Plan F. The local church is encouraged to provide full premium reimbursement in the most tax
 efficient manner as referenced above.

10. Tax Sheltered Annuity (TSA), Life and Disability Insurance

• That the local church board give consideration to the specially designed plan of tax-sheltered annuities (TSA), term life insurance, and disability insurance for ministers offered through Pensions and Benefits, USA. Ministers may choose to open their own TSA or 403(b) plan through their own personal financial advisor. If so, the minister is cautioned to be aware that such plan may not allow distributions upon retirement to be classified as housing allowance as is the case with the plan administered through Pensions and Benefits, USA.

II. Evangelist's Support

- 1. That each church set a minimum financial remuneration for its revival and special workers and indicate such amount at the time of the call, to be considered annually when the pastor's salary is reviewed (guidelines are available free of charge from the USA/Canada Mission/Evangelism Office, 17001 Prairie Star Parkway, Lenexa, KS 66220).
- 2. That financial planning for revivals and special services be arranged before the workers arrive and that the church give the proper attention to the personal care of the evangelist, such as meals, lodging, travel and social security reimbursement.
- 3. That the churches, where commissioned evangelists or commissioned song evangelists hold their membership and give regular support with their tithes and offerings, give consideration to assist the evangelist to attend district and general functions.
- 4. That retired ministers and active evangelists be used as pulpit supply in churches and that the supply pastor be informed ahead of time by the church as to the amount of remuneration and the allowance

of provisions made for travel, lodging, housing and meals; that the pulpit supply remuneration keep pace with the pastors' salaries; and that, when possible, churches where retired ministers hold their membership give consideration to assist in the cost of health insurance.

III. District Finance

- 1. That all local churches pay their District budget allocation in full on a ten-month basis, with the first payment to be made in April.
- 2. That we establish a "Budget Base" for each church. The Budget Base shall be the total for the immediately preceding three years of "Total Used for Local Mission" (line 49 from the Annual Pastor's Report), less amounts paid as "Buildings, Properties and Capital Improvements" (line 44), "Pastor, Associate & Support Staff Benefits" (medical, retirement, housing, etc.: line 46a) and "Debt Service" (line 45).
- 3. That a five percent credit be awarded to each local church that pays its District Budget in accordance with the Ten-Month Payment Plan.

The Ten–Month Payment Plan: wherein the local church pays its assigned District Budget in ten equal monthly installments with the final payment to be received by the District Treasurer on or before January 31. The District Treasurer shall administer the plan and report the progress of each church to its church treasurer monthly via the District Budget Statement.

Administration of the Ten-Month Payment Plan shall be governed as follows:

- a. Each monthly District budget payment must be received by the District Treasurer no later than the last day of the month.
- b. The monthly District budget payment is to be paid in full by the local church without regard for any credit that may be earned in the current year.
- c. The 5 percent credit is cumulative, that is, for each of the 10 months that a local church is current with the year—to—date amounts that are due as of that date under the Ten-Month Payment Plan, such church shall receive a credit equal to one-half percent of the assigned annual budget.
 - Example: If a church is current each of the 10 months, the equivalent of 5 percent credit shall be earned (one-half percent X 10 months = 5 percent). Because the credit is earned on a monthly basis, a church may qualify for a partial credit even though the church was not current for each of the 10 months.
- d. The District Treasurer shall compute credits at the end of the church year and the local church shall be granted the option of: (a) application of its credit to its District budget assignment for the following year; or (b) application of its credit to the current District budget of a partner church in financial need. Please note: Credit earned by churches that have not paid their District budget in full shall be applied first to the unpaid portion of the current District budget.
- e. In the new year, credits remaining will be posted on the March 31 District Budget Statement and the first monthly payment made by the local church shall be reduced by those discounts earned the prior year.

- 4. That the District, Church Growth & Missional Support, Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries International (SDMI), and Nazarene Youth International (NYI) Operating budget for 2021-2022 be set at \$602,899 and that the Net Adjusted Expenditure Budget (the total operating budget reduced by endowment fund allocations and adjusted for prior year excess and/or deficit variance) be set at \$476,526. See District Expenditure Budget attached as exhibit A.
- 5. That the District Net Adjusted Expenditure Budget be adjusted upward in anticipation of a collection rate of 92.5 percent and a pre-payment discount rate of 3.9 percent, resulting in the District Allocation Budget of \$515,163. The allocation to each local church shall be the necessary percentage of the Budget Base to reach this amount.
- 6. That one-twelfth of the SDMI Budget and the NYI Budget be forwarded to each entity monthly. Funds designated for children and youth camps will be distributed upon request, subject to Advisory Board approval. All priorities of fixed and discretionary expenses included in the District Operating Budget shall be determined at the discretion of the District Advisory Board.
- 7. That the District Allocation Budget be allocated to the churches using the following percentages:

Adjusted Budget Base	<u>Percentage</u>
\$20,000 and under	1.00
20,001 to 30,000	1.50
30,001 to 40,000	2.00
40,001 to 47,000	2.50
47,001 to 55,000	3.00
55,001 to 65,000	3.50
65,001 and above	4.00

Before applying the percentage, an additional \$4,000 shall be deducted from the Budget Base of each church whose Budget Base is less than \$100,001 to arrive at an Adjusted Budget Base.

Since applying the above percentages to the Adjusted Budget Base yields more than the proposed 2021-2022 District Expenditure Budget, there has been a reduction calculated into the amount allocated to each church.

8. Funding the Mission – Every local church worldwide is challenged to give at least 5.5 percent of its current year income to the World Evangelism Fund (WEF). In the USA, churches are asked to give another 2.25 percent to Pensions and Benefits (P&B), and 2.25 percent to the regional University, as well as funding the District ministries. All churches should be utilizing www.fundingthemission.org, the online tool, to both report their monthly income and calculate their allocations. The site also provides up-to-date information on a church's progress in funding the mission beyond the local church.

Church income is defined as any donation received by the church that qualifies as a charitable contribution for IRS tax purposes. Non-cash gifts of \$5,000 or less do not need to be included in "Total Church Income" (line 29 from the Annual Pastor's Report). They are never a part of the income base. This is unrelated to the Rare Circumstance Adjustment for which churches may apply in the event of a large designated gift, financial disaster, or other rare circumstance that may inhibit the church's ability to participate in fund allocations.

- 9. That the World Evangelism Fund for 2021-2022 is equal to 5.5 percent of current year church income. Churches are encouraged to send WEF and Ten Percent Mission Special dollars to the General Treasurer through the online giving tools at www.fundingthemission.org or, if online giving is not feasible, to mail payment to the General Treasurer at PO Box 843116, Kansas City, MO 64184.
- 10. That giving for Pensions and Benefits for 2021-2022 shall be equal to 2.25 percent of current year church income. Churches are encouraged to send P&B dollars to the General Treasurer through the online giving tools at www.fundingthemission.org or, if online giving is not feasible, to mail payment to the General Treasurer at PO Box 843116, Kansas City, MO 64184.
- 11. That giving for Education for 2021-2022 be equal to 2.25 percent of current year church income. We recommend that our local churches consider maintaining the funding level for Education at 2.5 percent of current church year income. After reporting income to www.fundingthemission.org, which calculates the allocation for Education, remit funds to the Northwest District Office.
- 12. That the Northwest District (NWD) Nazarene Missions International (NMI) allocation to each local church will be based on a percent of the World Evangelism Fund Goal from the church year ending two years previous (2019-2020).
 - a. The funding and operating budget shall be presented annually and shall be approved through the district finance procedure (similar to NYI and SDMI) including the resulting percentage allocation.
 - b. The NMI treasurer shall be responsible for the billing and collection of dues.
- 13. That auxiliary treasurers submit financial statements, including a balance sheet and statement of revenue and expenses compared to budget, to the district office quarterly.
- 14. That each auxiliary provide a comparative year over year budget, current balance sheet, income statement and cash flow statement, to the pre-assembly Finance Sub-Committee early in February, as determined by the district office, to aid in setting the total District, SDMI and NYI Budgets.
- 15. That each auxiliary complete a financial review annually.
- 16. That the amounts of remuneration for the assembly pages, assistant secretary, ballot secretary, office assistants, recording secretary and statistical secretary be referred to the District Superintendent and the District Advisory Board.
- 17. That an electronic copy of the 2021 District Journal be sent to each church.
- 18. That for purposes of continuity throughout the district all district departments shall reimburse automobile mileage at a rate equal to 50 percent of the applicable IRS business mileage reimbursement rate determined annually on March 1. The district's philosophy is to cover the direct cost of travel but not depreciation and replacement cost. In lieu of cash reimbursement for mileage, the IRS allows a deduction of 14 cents per mile.
- 19. That the spending rate for the District Endowment Fund be set at 1.5 percent of Net Adjusted Endowment Assets as of December 31 for budget allocation reduction (with a minimum amount of \$40,000) and 2.5 percent for contribution to other special projects (Next Step Grants, etc.) for a total spend down rate of 4 percent.

IV. Other Local Church Financial Matters

- That the pastor give special attention to filing the non-profit corporation registration with the Secretary of State and the appropriate tax exemption forms for the church properties by the appropriate due date.
- 2. That each local church review and determine the adequacy of its property and casualty and general liability insurance on an annual basis.
- 3. That each local church review and determine the adequacy of its professional liability insurance on an annual basis.
- 4. That the church board of each local church prepare an operating budget for each fiscal year and that a copy be made available to the District Superintendent upon request.
- 5. That the church board of each local church arrange for a counting committee to comply with Manual provisions (129.22) and be responsible for providing a weekly report of all finances, with a copy given to the pastor, treasurer and financial secretary.
- 6. That any church considering a capital campaign would first review the available resources provided by the district, which can be found on the district website ("Are You Ready for a Capital Campaign?" and "Selecting Counsel for Your Capital Campaign").
- 7. That the church board establish in writing a donor and designated gift policy, clearly defining and communicating said policy to donors and congregation.
- 8. That each local church consider utilizing the Church of the Nazarene Foundation to facilitate planned and deferred gifts from their members to any Nazarene ministry, including gifts to the local church, and to use the Foundation to manage investment accounts, endowments or charitable trusts. Visit www.NazareneFoundation.org or call 866-273-2549.
- 9. That the church board of each local church comply with Manual provisions (129.23) and be responsible for appointing an audit committee.
- 10. NNU Trustees Matching Scholarship. For many years, Northwest Nazarene University (NNU) has joined with Northwest District in providing financial incentives for students who continue their higher education at NNU. This partnership is tied to the percentage of the Educational Budget paid (2.25 percent of Total Church Income) on the part of each church and a donation by each church in the name of their students. These elements will determine the multiplication factor that NNU is able to provide to the student's Trustees Matching Scholarship. For 2021-2022, the match formulas used by the Financial Aid Office are:

The Trustees Matching Scholarship program is administered under the following guidelines:

- 1. Each church should develop appropriate criteria (by board action) to establish and fund this program, define eligibility and commit to this ongoing covenant with NNU.
- 2. The year of record for calculating match ratios is the immediate past year.
- 3. The church board should affirm participation through formal action each year, determine the award for each student and inform the University of the students deemed eligible.
- 4. Renewal of the full eligibility for subsequent years will depend upon the student achieving at least satisfactory academic progress.
- 5. It is requested that contributions be made prior to August 15 (or August 15 and December 12 if made per semester). The registration process will be expedited for students whose funds have been received prior to registration deadlines. This will enable the student's accounts to be credited prior to the beginning of the semester. Funds cannot be matched prior to receipt of the church contribution. If a student does not register, the church's contribution will be refunded to the church. Match provided by NNU can only be used toward tuition cost.
- 6. Student must be completing a first BA/BS degree.
- 7. The church's contribution may exceed the \$350 match limit. Match provided by NNU can only be used toward tuition cost.

NOTE 4 - INVESTMENTS

Investments are recorded at market value, as reported on the regular monthly statement, with closing date of February 29, 2020.





It can be such a blessing when we take the step of faith, with courage, and walk where we do not feel equipped to go; into God's will.



God has been faithful in providing resources this year to continue to pay our building rent payment as well as all bills including budgets. A big positive during this church year was we were able to do community outreach in a big way. Praise God for His faithfulness to His people and prayers being answered. We are all looking forward to what God has planned for Benton City New Beginnings in the coming church year. We all know our hope is in Him.

The Lord has provided a song leader, an amazing pianist, a sound operator, visiting preachers when we needed them, and the funds to upgrade a few pieces of equipment. We had the opportunity to use free radio air time to reach six counties for Jesus once per week for a half an hour each from Easter to Pentecost. What a blessed time that was! Our people put together gift packages to hand out to the people of an apartment complex for Christmas as messages of hope. The packages were well received. In these ways, we sensed the faithfulness of the Lord, even as we endured the uncertainty of lockdowns, state regulations and the global fear of disease. We look forward to watching what the Lord will do through us and His people throughout the coming year as we continue to look for creative ways to join Him in His work!

We can grumble, fight, and complain as we wander in our modern desert, or we can endure with grace, compassion, and sacrifice which will not only benefit others but also bring about growth in our own lives. God has been faithful in empowering our people to choose perseverance. One team with limited funds built a handicap accessible deck onto the home of man in a wheelchair at no charge. One couple, who just a few short years ago were addicted to drugs and living in their car, has experienced spiritual renewal, baptism, and recovery through their struggles. Today both are following Jesus and sacrificing for others. This week they are closing on the purchase of a new home. Our board has united during this chaos as well. Every single vote in 2020 was unanimous! During the shutdown, our children learned that the church lives beyond the walls as they received bible lessons and games delivered to their doorsteps by our kid's workers. We expect difficulties ahead but we are walking in the way. We are grateful for God's faithfulness in fostering growth through the struggle. Church ON!

During these challenging times, how has God been faithful to you and your church? (200-400 words)

Psalm 23 comes to mind as I think about this last year. When the psalm begins, the Lord is addressed in the third person: The Lord, He, etc. But in the middle of the psalm, the psalmist begins addressing the Lord in second person: You. The switch happens right in verse 4 when the psalmist walks through the valley of the shadow of death. Something changes in that moment and the prayer is no longer talking about God, but to God. The prayer becomes more personal. The year 2020 has been a challenging time for me and the church in Naches. Yet God has in no way felt distant to us. To the contrary, He has drawn us closer to Him. As our congregation has not been able to gather fully in person in this last year, we have been required to be more intentional in reaching out to each other. This intentionality has, in some ways, brought us closer together. This year has forced us to find unique ways to engage and study the scriptures and pray with one another. Again, this has forced us to be intentional and creative. All told, this year has taught us the importance of dependence upon God. We went into the year with plans that ended up getting erased. While there is much to lament in what was lost, we have also been given opportunities that we may not have been given otherwise. In this last year we have navigated a pandemic while pursuing a furnace replacement project simultaneously. During these challenging times, how has God been faithful to you and your church? (200-400 words)

It has been a great year of opportunity in Wenatchee! Early on in the pandemic our leadership team decided to focus on community care even as we had to curtail in-person meeting. One month into the pandemic we gave \$12,000 to Serve Wenatchee Valley, the primary Christian aid agency in our region. We were their largest church donor this year! In addition, we adopted a local elementary school and provided them with more than \$1000 in aid to cover supply costs for low income students. We also provided significant resourcing to Wenatchee Family Counseling Services, the ministry of Dr. Norm Stueckle, which provides free counseling for those in need. All of our teens and children received routine care packages from the church. More than 100 children on our mailing list were sent a home VBS package that included a children's Bible and do-it-yourself activities. With our building largely empty much of the year, we focused on facilities upgrades. And we invested heavily in technology as we look toward the future. While meeting in large numbers proved challenging, we used this unique year to expand our small group ministries. Each week we challenged our people online and in person with this phrase: "If you have a little extra, give a little extra. BUT if you or someone you know is in need, please reach out to the church!" Through the grace of God we were able to meet every request we received! God is Good!

During these challenging times, how has God been faithful to you and your church? (200-400 words)

We really did not know what to expect as the scope of Covid 19 continued to enlarge both in duration and intensity. There was considerable personal concern about how we were going to be The Church under these circumstances. We had responses initially from deep concern and action that reflected that. Conversely we had others who saw no reason to do anything different. A compromise for us began in May. We started having a parking lot service where we preached from the bed of a pickup and people listened in their cars. This shifted in October to services in the sanctuary with taped off seating and mask wearing. To this day that is what we are doing. We draw about 60% of our previous attendance. There are still those who have not started attending yet but if trends continue they will be joining in-person services soon. We have not taken a side on this, as there is not any side to take. We have members who work in hospice and the ER and their experience is different than others. We have people who have not had any deaths or illnesses close to them and others who have. So, of course they would experience Covid differently. We make audio tapes of our services and we also stream our services on Facebook and YouTube. This has allowed people to stay connected. We have had an increase in giving to our second highest total in 30 years. I know this is only money but I think it is the result of a deeper reality. People in the face of adversity give. Jesus said "You did not choose me I chose you." The Scripture also says that we are to be like him. If this is so, and I believe it is, then we also love what he loves and rally to protect what he died to institute. God is good and we expectantly look forward to what can be done in the coming year.





During these challenging times, how has God been faithful to you and your church? (200-400 words)

We have seen the faithfulness of God not only through his sustaining presence itself, but especially through the unified, missional, and generous response of the people of West Valley Church. WVC has remained committed to one another by abiding by the safety policies as instructed by the state and by WVC's Leadership Team, in order to protect one another, especially for the sake of the weakest and most susceptible. Throughout this time they have stayed connected to one another through zoom small groups and through checking on one another. WVC's volunteers were able to purchase supplies for, and build, from the ground up, a fully-functional livestream video and sound editing system so that, in September of 2020, we were able to begin experiencing worship live together from our own homes. As things were opened up by the state, we have been able to continue our online presence as well as our in-house worship services and have developed a significant online community of believers at WVC from in town, outside the state, and even outside the country. WVC has given thousands of dollars to be distributed to families that are hit hard during this time, through job loss, by providing groceries and meals, and helping with the strained finances of homes, particularly of single parents and the elderly. WVC launched a three-year capital campaign in February of 2020 with a goal of \$1.6 million to eliminate debt and renovate the sanctuary. The official beginning of giving was postponed from March to May. From March until September, we were not worshiping in person and only by pre-recorded services. To this day (March of 2021) we have been worshiping at only 25% capacity in sanctuary. Still, in only ten months we have raised over \$900,000, while at the same time achieving beyond our budget projections in general giving for the year. This kind of "loaves and fishes" outcome can only be attributed to God's people fully giving what they have to the Lord, and His gracious multiplication of those gifts. We recognize these as indicators of the faithfulness of God; that his sustaining us in these days also affirms his plans for us in the future.


