How has God been writing His story into the lives of your people and community?

God's story is always a story of redemption, and of Him uniting people in a bond of holy love. We've seen it happen a number of ways at FIRSTNAZ this year.

A group of people at FIRSTNAZ started an early morning workout group modeled after CrossFit. They meet three times each week in a shop that belongs to one of the men in the group. Each of the participants occasionally invites a new person to join them in the express interest of that person being drawn into a loving community. They often reach to people whom others wouldn't think to ask, to teens, and occasionally to people who have drifted away from the church. With no planned prayer time, prayer requests often surface, and the group responds immediately. Redemption... holy love... that's God's story, right?

Pastor Cliff and Laura Purcell led a four-week workshop designed to help couples make their marriages both healthy and holy. Over forty people attended with young engaged couples and retired couples alike learning how to draw closer and to handle conflict in ways that unite them, even settling some grievances and wounds through the act of forgiveness. Redemption... holy love... that's God's story, right?

A couple left the fellowship and the Nazarene denomination years ago because of anger toward a new pastor. After a simple but compassionate hospital visitation, the couple has decided to put the differences of the past behind them and return to our fellowship. Redemption... holy love... that's God's story, right?

Yeah, that's God's story. And it's sooo right.

How has God been writing His story into the lives of your people and community?

The 2018-19 church year has been another great year in which God has proved Himself faithful. The Lord has helped Lewiston Orchards Nazarene Church (LONC) have a ministry to our community for nearly 68 years. He continues to use this body of believers to make an impact in the Lewis-Clark Valley for His Kingdom.

Because of God's faithfulness, we are seeing many in our church family growing in Christlikeness and becoming more like Jesus. The vast majority of our people in our church have been Christ-followers for most of their lives, with some "speed bumps" along life's journey. Nevertheless, most have held steady, wanting with each passing day to be obedient to Christ, stay within the center of His will, and love their neighbor just like Jesus does. We are not content with just seeing the "Saints" grow, but we are glad they are growing. We are still looking for creative ways to reach our community for Jesus, and the Lord has proven Himself faithful as we have added to our church family new followers of Christ. So, LONC is slowly reaping a new harvest of disciples.

Several ministries are making an impact, not only within the body of believers at LONC, but also in our local community:

Free Community Lunch: For the past year, LONC has been ministering to our community with a free lunch. On the fourth Saturday of each month, the church provides a hot cooked meal to help feed the working poor and senior adults on fixed incomes, along with individuals and families who are having a difficult time making ends meet. Approximately 600 meals have been served.

Quilting & Sewing Ministry: This past year, women in our Quilting and Sewing Ministry have made 17 new blankets for St. Gertrude's Monastery in Cottonwood, ID. They also made numerous baby blankets for Life Choices Clinic, a pregnancy center that serves young women who are pregnant.

Small Group Ministry: Small Groups continue to be a very important ministry to our church, which has also been used to reach out to our neighbors and friends. Currently we have four small groups that meet on a weekly basis.

How has God been writing His story into the lives of your people and community?

God's story is being written into the lives of kids all over the Palouse, but this story starts a ways down the road, in a small town in the Lewiston/Clarkston Valley. For nearly eight years we've traveled in and out of Lapwai, Idaho for basketball games. Working and coaching at the middle school, I've had the opportunity to get to know the coaches and kids, and even some of the parents have become familiar. These people love basketball. They play as a team from a very young age and compete for state titles when they get to high school. Basketball is part of their culture and they are REALLY good at it.

Unfortunately, we inherited a history of animosity between Lapwai and Pullman. Game time was more than a friendly competition. In fact there was nothing friendly about it. Every time we encountered them the guard went up. Parents arguing with parents in the stands, fans disrespecting the referees, students and players being much less than kind to one another on the court. In a word, it was toxic.

In the off season, we ran into one of the coaches who had a team of boys playing in an AAU tournament. He is a friendly guy, and we chatted briefly about the weekend as we watched this group of ten kids pile into a van and waited for their coach to join them. He explained that many of the families cannot afford to come out and support their kids in an overnight competition, so he drives them all together using his own van, taking care of their food and lodging, all so they can compete in the off season doing what they love. That encounter sparked an idea.

This fall, we decided to try to "turn the ship" on our relationship with these neighbors in hopes to turn them into friends. With the help of our community in and around the school, we welcomed Lapwai with open arms at our first home game of the season. We tried to be creative in meeting their needs while also writing God's story of love into their lives. We customized a large rolling cooler and filled it with snacks and treats they could take with them. We made personalized signs for each of the players and coaches that hung in the locker room to greet them as they walked in. We hung signs of encouragement and welcome in the halls, and we encouraged our students and players to choose to take the first step toward kindness. I received an email from the athletic director and coaches the following day. They both made it a point to say that "no one has ever done anything like this for our kids" and "this kind of thing just never happens to us."

The players from the opposing team helped us set up the gym for the game and offered assistance to our administrative staff during halftime. When the game was over, they quickly changed clothes and helped us clean up the gym before packing up to head home. By the time we got home that night, there were more than 100 posts on social media from parents and fans from the Valley, expressing gratitude and admiration for our community just up the hill.

God's continuing story is written by those who follow His example. Love God. Love People.


